

Sunrise is on the A26 between Tonbridge and Tunbridge Wells, opposite the cricket green in Southborough. The site is shared with Barnardo's Meadows School. The closest bus stop is **The Fountain, Southborough**, a minute's walk down London Road. **Tonbridge Rail Station** offers regular rail links and is a short bus ride away.

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Sunrise has a residential short breaks unit, "The Den," and a resource play area, available for children accessing The Den, Barnardo's clubs & playschemes. The resource area is also available for hire and offers the following facilities...

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

The Sunrise Centre is managed by Kent County Council, who work in partnership with Barnardo's, to deliver a range of services from overnight accommodation (in "The Den") to after-school clubs, weekend activities, playschemes, and holiday events.
