Who we are and what we do





Who are we?

We work in partnership with special schools to make sure children with complex health needs can access education safely.

We work collaboratively with school staff – empowering them through training and competency assessments – to deliver care to students whose needs can be safely delegated. This increases the number of people available that can safely care for and support the students at school.

School staff are supported to be confident and competent through training and assessment, which is completed annually or sooner, if required.



What do we do?

Our team of specialist nurses are committed to making sure students receive high quality care at school and we support students with more complex health needs by:

- carrying out nursing assessments and liaising with other healthcare professionals
- delivering core health training to school staff – asthma, seizure awareness and management, pressure area care awareness
- training and competency assessing school staff to safely carry out specific health tasks bespoke to the student, for example enteral feeding, tracheostomy care, oral suctioning
- supporting the school in completing personalised care and support plans for those children with higher complexities
- making sure there are clear escalation plans for students so school staff can be responsive to student's needs













- supporting the student to return to school following a change in health need
- contributing to the student's Education and Health Care Plan and annual review, as required
- complete continence assessments and product reviews for those children and young people with complex health needs
- nurses work with wider health professionals and multi agency partners to support the children's health needs
- supporting transition to adult services.

Some students may have health needs that are not suitable to delegate to school staff and where this is the case, the nurses will discuss jointly with the school and parents/ carers to decide what arrangements or plans need to be made.

Any child or young person with a health need attending one of the named special schools has access to the Special School Nursing Service.
